Recommendations to keep your product looking its best over the years

Our Outdoor collection is certified for outdoor use, ideal for verandas and terraces. Despite the high durability of the materials, it is crucial to conduct weekly maintenance to ensure the product's quality characteristics are perfectly preserved. We recommend the immediate removal of food and drink residues, leaves, flowers, and bird droppings. For storage, a thorough cleaning and drying should be followed by the application of a rain cover. The furniture should be stored in a dry, well-ventilated area.

Maintenance for **Lacquered Metal Furniture** (Recommended for Covered Outdoor Areas):

Routine Cleaning: Clean lacquered metal surfaces with a damp cloth and mild soap solution. Avoid using abrasive cleaners or scrubbing pads that could damage the lacquer finish.
