#### More than 20% of the jobs created are precarious

According to the National Institute of Statistics, more than 20% of the jobs created in Portugal since the second trimester of 2017 are precarious, temporary or part-time jobs. Comparing to other EU countries, Portugal comes in third, after Poland and Spain, with the highest share of temporary employees.
