Transmalhar derives from 'trembling' (losing one's way) to assume the act of wandering in public space and claim it as a place of manifesto, proposing revolutionary corpographies and wanderings.As a transdisciplinary practice, it uses democracy, citizenship and equality as methods of co-creation, co-decision and co-responsibility of individuals in a community, empowering them.

From the self —body—territory triad, Transmalhar promotes civic participation and artistic creation, individualy and collectively. Transmalhar is the act of wandering through the territory, in the creative transdisciplinarity use of the triad SELF—BODY—TERRITORY. This generates new relationships within the local community and the natural, material and immaterial heritage.



Transmalhar is a pilot project in Ponta Delgada that will take place from October 2023 to December 2025. It is made up of different moments that, in addition, aim at two co-creations, using the values of democracy, equality and citizenship as a method: one that celebrates, the 25Th April day, 2024, the Revolution of '74; another that will be a proposal for the territory, exploring art as a civic act. These are the moments:

Transmalhar Artistic Residency: group of 15 students (12-18 years old) ESAQ with Transmalhar transdisciplinary team composed by Helena Oliveira (dance) and Rita Serra e Silva (architecture), with the aim of co-creating an artistic project to be presented at the Walk&Talk Biennial (2024-25).

Elephant in camel skin

"The Elephant in this story has unique characteristics that make it different from all other elephants, namely, having camel skin. How will the other animals treat it? And how will the Elephant in Camel Skin feel in this jungle that is life?"

Based on creative processes with community groups – in close connection with environmental issues – and using artistic tools, namely: body expression, illustration and writing, the collective "Poesia no Corpo. Corpo na Poesia", made up of citizens (children, young people and adults) set out to create a story, using a metaphor, whose main character is the Elephant. In many literary sources, the Elephant symbolizes: wisdom, persistence, determination, solidarity, sociability, friendship, companionship and memory.

Promoted by Casa dos Choupos – Coopreativa Multisectorial de Solidariedade Social, CRL, the Poesia no Corpo Corpo na Poesia project aims to experiment with performance in an attempt to transform a space, taking into account collective creation and the performer as a whole being.

It promotes intergenerationality and collective involvement, with the participation of 12 individuals whose ages vary between 12 and 76 years old. If, on the one hand, Poetry benefits from being a place open to the intersection of other arts, namely Dance, Dance also benefits from being able to experience other universes, such as that of the Word.

Are you looking at me? It's a play about dancing in people's lives, about surrender and sharing. Dancing with Eyes Closed. Dancing in a group. Dance alone. Dancing in the street. Dancing at Home. Dancing with someone else... Twelve people of different ages demonstrate the pleasure of dancing in a piece that reflects on intimacy and desire. When dancing, each performer is rewarded with the sensation of that pleasure, through movements present in their lives.

"We live in a time that treats violence in a contradictory way. On the one hand, it seeks to repress it judicially, on the other hand, it contributes, through inequality, to its expansion. "Us", a piece about being and wanting to be, growing, belonging, occupying, screaming, dancing...

This work is a collective creation and a co-production of the Escolhas em Movimento project, in partnership with the Instituto Profissional do Terço, the Augusto Gil Group and with the support of Porto City Council. It brings together around 30 children and young people from the EB 1 da Fontinha and EB 2-3 Augusto Gil Schools and represents the result of the work carried out throughout the year by the dance groups promoted by the project. This is an initiative that simultaneously aims to commemorate the second anniversary of the project and promote closer ties with the surrounding community.

Identity was the motto chosen by the children and young people participating in this project based on questions such as: who am I, what do I want to be when I grow up, where am I from, what do I want, what do I like, how do I relate to others. We are what they made of us - the construction of the I starts from the relationship of sharing and belonging, from being with the other, from the we. It is here that everything begins, then development continues with identification with models that increasingly become a choice of oneself and identity is assumed as identification with others fades.

"Us" is the result of a co-constructed process with children and young people - an artistic performance that is born and grows based on the relationship with one's own body and the other. Movement, silence and the word come together and form the pillars of a dynamic and (still) unfinished construction that allowed artistic and creative expression to all those who participated in it.
